Connecticut allows "non-permanent" chronic illness conditions to qualify and receive benefits with the Accelerated Access Solution® rider

Effective October 02, 2017, Connecticut will allow both permanent and "non-permanent" chronic illness conditions to qualify* for benefits when using the Accelerated Access Solution rider. Previously, in CT, a condition had to be permanent in order to qualify as a chronic illness. This will be a positive change for applicants, providing more opportunity to receive living benefits from their policy through the Accelerated Access Solution rider.

New Connecticut Accelerated Access Solution (AAS) Transition Rules for Secure Lifetime GUL 3, Max Accumulator+, Value+ Protector and Platinum Choice VUL 2:

- Any policy print dated on or after Oct 2, 2017 will receive the new AAS rider
- Applications with illustrations dated on or after Oct 2, 2017 will automatically receive the new AAS rider, regardless of application date
- Applications with illustrations dated before Oct 2, 2017 will also receive the new AAS rider, though a revised illustration and signature will be required

^{*}Qualification requires a 90 day elimination period to be met.
